## Public Health Nurse Consultant - Partnering for Vaccine Equity Program

Remote; Up to 20 hours per week October 1, 2022 – April 29, 2023

The Public Health Nurse Consultant will work within the CDC Foundation's Infectious Diseases Federal Program team to support the Partnering for Vaccine Equity Program (P4VE) team and grant-funded community-based organizations (CBO) and other sub-recipients as the subject matter expert in CDC-recommended adult immunization.

The consultant will be independently responsible for the following activities and deliverables:

- Serve as the P4VE program subject matter expert for CBOs and CDC Foundation program staff on clinical adult immunization information with a health equity focus.
- Create or curate CBO capacity building tools, information, and resources relating to adult vaccination outreach, education, and vaccine administration programming, and fact-check related materials.
- Support CBOs in expanding their current scope of work to include adult vaccinations and provide technical assistance as requested
- Meet individually or in groups with CBOs to provide medically informed consultation and education about adult immunization programming and/or enhance their adult vaccination program
- Create and host at least one webinar (preferably 2 3) for CBOs to educate on CDC-recommended adult vaccination
- Area of consultation and outreach may be at multiple levels, such as community, city, county, state or national.
- Participate as a member of the Vaccine Resource Hub's subject matter expert committee and provide clinical information for the VRH online virtual assistant.

## **Qualifications:**

- 1. Requires graduation from an accredited school of nursing and a current registered nurse license; a minimum of a Bachelor's degree in nursing with a Master's degree in Public Health
- 2. A minimum of four years of nursing practice or experience as a medical professional in a public health agency, clinic, or hospital setting required
- 3. A minimum of two years of professional nursing experience, one year of which was in the public health setting
- 4. A minimum of two years of immunization education and/or administration experience

## **Skill Set Desired:**

- 1. Proficiency in use of Microsoft Office Suite
- 2. Demonstrated knowledge of the current CDC-supported adult immunization schedule
- 3. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively and maintain favorable public relations

- 4. Demonstrated ability to work independently and within teams in a positive, culturally aware, and professional manner
- 5. Experience working in a virtual environment with remote partners and teams
- 6. Experience working with state, tribal, local, or territorial health departments or community-based organizations preferred
- 7. Experience providing individualized technical and programmatic support over phone or videoconferenced meetings
